TED S. MILLER POSTHUMOUSLY INDUCTED INTO METAL CONSTRUCTION HALL OF FAME

Miller posthumously joined the 2013 Hall of Fame Class of the Metal Construction Association. It was a moving ceremony that highlighted the careers of Ted and his peers and all of us who attended felt fortunate to be there.

There was an easel set up near the stage for each member of the class and on that was a display of some of the recipient's accomplishments and contributions to the industry and also a quote attributed to them. Here were Ted's:

- Award winning salesman for H.H. Robertson Co. from 1972-1979
- Co-founder of The Miller-Clapperton Partnership, Inc., which today provides employment for 100 + people
- Board member of the Metal Construction Association
- Chaired Metal Construction Association committee to establish Certified Premium Fabricator criteria/selection and then served as founding chairman of the MCM Fabricator's Council
- Recipient of the 2013 MCA Larry A. Swaney award for exemplary service to the Metal Construction industry

- Member of Construction Advisory Board for Southern Polytechnic University
- Monthly contributor to *Metal Architecture*
- Writer of a weekly blog for Miller-Clapperton
- Overcame 11 international competitors to be awarded the Beijing International Airport–Terminal 2 project
- Pioneered with Reynolds Metals Company in 1988 to introduce competing ACM products to what had previously been a monopoly market
- Served as Deacon, Sunday School teacher, choir member, and on Leadership Team of Smyrna First Baptist Church
- Devoted husband of 41 years to Jo Dendy Miller
